This course explores decoloniality as a practical and analytical orientation to confrontations with the entrenched injustices identified with coloniality. The course considers decoloniality through characteristic projects, practices and globalized movements to decolonize knowledge, livelihoods, politics and community.

Identify the ways in which “decoloniality” is deployed as a theoretical, critical concept as well as a set of transformative practices in daily community life.

Mobilize (i.e., apply) critical understandings of “decoloniality” and understand how these are deployed in specific theoretical works and political projects.

Analyze and demonstrate critical awareness on the ways in which Indigenous peoples engage and may challenge, in practice, certain understandings of decoloniality.
