

Huron University College awards up to ten Hellmuth Scholarships valued at full tuition for up to four years to entering students who display outstanding academic achievement together with a strong record of extra-curricular activities and community outreach. **The application deadline is February 12th, 2021.**

Eligibility: Hellmuth Scholars must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents of Canada. Applicants invited to apply must be in their last year of high school with a mid-year average of 90% or higher.

Nomination: In order to be considered for the Hellmuth Scholarship a school nomination is required. The nomination will include why the student is being recommended for the scholarship and any supporting information that would be helpful to the committee to understand why the student is exceptional in relation to other students. The nomination must come directly to Huron's Admissions Office from the nominees' email address.

Transcripts: A recent transcript is required to be submitted with this application. The transcript must be submitted by the school and sent directly to Huron's Admissions Office. *Students who are applying from an Ontario Secondary School will not need to submit a transcript.*

Letter of Intent: A letter to the committee (500 words) that explains why you would be a good candidate for the scholarship and how you will contribute to the Huron community both inside and outside of the classroom.

Resume: A resume highlighting your experiences over the past few years including academic accomplishments, extra-curricular activities, and leadership experiences.

Applications will be assessed based on a holistic evaluation of academic results, nomination, resume and statement of purpose. The committee will review all submissions and short-listed candidates will then be invited for a video interview.
