

ELIGIBILITY AND POLICIES OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

July 2024

Eligibility and tenability of all scholarships and awards granted by Huron University College are reserved for students registered at Huron only (minimum 3.0 credits) unless the provisions of a particular scholarship or award state otherwise. Scholarships will be applied to the second tuition installment and will be added to the student account prior to the final tuition payment deadline (December).

ELIGIBILITY OF ADMISSION SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships will be offered during the regular academic term (September – April), awarded to full-time students registered in 5.0 credits and meet Huron’s residency requirement. If a student is starting at Huron in Winter or Spring/Summer term and is eligible for an admission scholarship, the scholarship will be awarded in September.

ELIGIBILITY OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS WITH TRANSFER CREDIT

Where the basis of admission is secondary school or CEGEP, applicants will automatically be eligible for admission scholarships if the following conditions are met:

- a) The applicant applied directly from secondary school. (The applicant must not have attended a post-secondary institution, or attended a post-secondary institution and then returned to secondary school.)
- b) The applicant has completed the secondary school diploma successfully.
- c) The applicant meets the final admission average requirement.

APPLICANTS PRESENTING THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA OR GCSE AS THE BASIS OF ADMISSION

Applicants presenting the International Baccalaureate Diploma or A-Levels as the basis of admission may be granted advanced standing in subjects as determined by the policies of the Admissions Office. They may receive advanced standing for more than three subjects while remaining eligible for admission scholarships.

DEFERMENT OF ADMISSION

A student whose request to defer admission to the University has been granted for one year will also have their automatic entrance scholarship deferred. Scholarships that are not automatic are not eligible for deferral (i.e. Hellmuth Scholarship, International Presidential).

APPLICANTS TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTION

Applicants who have completed a recognized college program or previous studies at an approved university will automatically be reviewed by the Recruitment & Admissions Office for entrance scholarships.

IN-COURSE SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

In-course scholarships are available to current Huron students in the second year or above. To be eligible for an upper-year scholarship, students must be full-time and registered in 5.0 courses during the regular academic term (September – April) and meet the residency requirement, unless stated otherwise. Students must submit an application to be considered and recipients are selected based on performance and adherence within the specific award criteria. The selection of recipients will be made by Huron’s Student Awards Committee.

SCHOLARSHIP AND AWARDS MAXIMUM VALUES

Students paying domestic fees that are entering first-year at Huron are eligible to receive multiple scholarships to a maximum equal to tuition and ancillary fees (not including residence or meal plan). Returning students to Huron who pay domestic fees are eligible to receive multiple scholarships to a maximum of \$10,000/year. Huron students on a student visa are eligible to receive multiple scholarships to a maximum of 50% of tuition and ancillary fees.

PAYMENT OF UNIVERSITY ADMINISTERED SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

Any Huron administered scholarship/award/prize will be automatically applied to the recipient's tuition account. Credit balances will be issued in the form of a cheque or e-transfer and mailed to the sessional address/uwo email address.

FRANK HOLMES SCHOLARSHIP

Recipients of the Frank Holmes Scholarship must be registered on a university-level, intercollegiate athletic team at Western University. Continuation of the scholarship will be based on regular renewal terms, as well as the continuation of membership on an approved team. This is an athletic scholarship and will count towards the maximum value allowed by CIS and OUA.

IVEY DUAL DEGREE PROGRAMS

Students on a continuing scholarship who are enrolled in a Huron/Ivey HBA dual degree program will have their Huron continuing scholarship applied during their time at Huron. Recipients will receive the full scholarship for the first two years of study at Huron and then for fourth and fifth years, provided a minimum of 3.0 credits are at Huron and all continuing scholarship requirements are met.

INDUSTRY INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

Students are not permitted to receive scholarships in the academic year in which they participate in an industry internship program. Students who qualify to retain a continuing scholarship in the academic year in which they participate in an industry internship program are not permitted to receive the scholarship while participating in the industry internship program but are permitted to defer receipt of the continuing scholarship for one year.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Huron students participating in an international exchange program at Huron or within the Western University community, are eligible to receive scholarships for their time abroad if their tuition is paid to Huron.

CONTINUING SCHOLARSHIP TERMS

International Entrance Scholarships are renewable for up to four years unless the scholarship's terms state otherwise. Starting September 2024, to qualify for renewal, a final cumulative average of 75% in first year and 80% in subsequent years, with a minimum of 5.0 credits each academic year is required (September to April).

Domestic Entrance Scholarships (prior to 2024), are renewable up to four years unless the scholarships' terms state otherwise. To qualify for renewal, a final cumulative average of 80% is required, with a minimum of 5.0 credits each academic year (September to April).

Such applicants will be allowed to retain their scholarships, where applicable, for four years, or the completion of an Honors undergraduate degree (or equivalent), whichever comes first.

If a student is found responsible for misconduct under the Code of Student Conduct or commits a scholastic offence as defined by the Scholastic Discipline (Undergraduate/Graduate) policy, he/she may become ineligible for consideration or continuation of University awards, prizes, or scholarships at the discretion of the Dean or designate.

WITHDRAWAL OR REDUCED COURSE LOAD AFTER RECEIVING UNIVERSITY ADMINISTERED SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

Scholarship/Award recipients who withdraw or reduce their course load to less than 4.0 courses after registration shall be entitled to the prorated value of the scholarship/award only for the number of weeks attended full-time in the academic term. The number of weeks will be calculated using the date of course change or withdrawal.

REINSTATEMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP

Students who do not meet the terms of renewal for continuing scholarships will not be eligible to receive the scholarship in subsequent years.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Students that take a leave of absence from Huron will not have scholarships reinstated upon return to undergraduate studies.

SCHOLARSHIP APPEALS

Students who do not meet the terms of renewal for their scholarship are eligible to appeal. Students may appeal on the grounds that they have experienced exceptional circumstances that impacted their capacity to meet the required terms for renewal. Students will be required to complete the [Scholarship Appeal Form](#) and both this form and their Academic Record will be reviewed by the Dean and Provost's Office and the Office of the Registrar.
