This intermediate-level course builds upon previously acquired language skills in modern standard Chinese (Mandarin). Students will significantly expand their vocabulary and explore more complex grammatical structures. The course aims to develop all language skills, with a focus on advanced communication techniques and translation skills.

Learning Outcomes: one outcome per entry

- Recognize and use approximately 1000 Chinese characters
- Apply intermediate-level grammatical patterns and expressions in writing and speaking
- Communicate confidently in various contexts using modern standard Chinese
- Develop basic translation skills between Chinese and English
- Conceptualize, develop, and execute group projects in Chinese, which may include creating and presenting a script, producing a short film, or conducting an in-depth cultural analysis
