Course Description:

In Global Inequalities Based on Sexual Differences, students will learn to identify and reflect on gender and sexual inequalities and to develop practical tools to fight them. This class will cover issues, theories, and concepts from around the world, allowing students to deepen their understanding of how local and global challenges interconnect. Weekly lectures and discussions will examine inequalities across different arenas, including health, science, sports, arts, politics, education, mental health, and reproduction. Ultimately, students will be equipped with a strong set of tools to produce high-quality, critical examinations of both local and global matters related to gender relations and disparities.

Learning Outcomes: one outcome per entry

To give the students a solid understanding of themes related to Global Inequalities Based on Sexual Differences as well as the main theories, frameworks, and objects related to this thematic area.

To provide students with a solid basis for understanding how systemic oppression works and how it puts women, sexual minorities, and racial minorities at a disadvantage and in danger.

To explain the complex meaning of intersectionality and how different social markers operate and intersect.

To help students develop critical thinking to analyse the world around them and intervene in it.
