Course Description:

An advanced treatment of the collection, analysis, and interpretation of behavioural data, reviewing and extending the topics covered in Psychology 1100E; problems in the design and conduct of studies and experiments, operational definitions, experimental control and recording of behaviour, statistical treatment of data, including descriptive and inferential statistics.

Antirequisite: Psychology 2810 or the former 283Y

Prerequisite: at least 60% in Psychology 1100E.

Learning Outcomes: one outcome per entry

By the end of the course students should be able to: choose appropriate statistical tests for data sets,

perform basic descriptive and inferential statistical procedures using hand calculations,

understand the meaning of statistical significance,

and interpret basic statistical software output.
