### **Course Description:**

This course serves as an introduction to Modern Standard Chinese (Mandarin) as a foreign language for beginners. The main goal for this course is for students to acquire a culturally contextualized working knowledge of and essential skills in introductory Chinese. The course aims at developing four basic skills, reading, writing, listening, and speaking, and at building a solid foundation in preparation for more advanced studies.

### **Learning Outcomes:**

Establish a mastery of the pinyin romanization system and can pronounce and transcribe correctly sounds used in modern standard Chinese;

Have a good command of basic strokes and stroke-order for writing Chinese characters;

Read short texts and write approximately 400 characters;

Master basic sentence patterns and use them to produce sentences;

Conduct simple conversations in Chinese;
