Course Description:

This course introduces students to the literary theory of ecocriticism and explores the representation of nature and environment in Chinese literature and film in the contemporary era of industrialization, modernization, and urbanization. The course focuses particularly on the relationship that various Chinese communities have with the natural world and the influence of politics, ethnicity, gender, and class on such relationships. The course is taught in Chinese.

- Outline the major developments in ecocriticism in Chinese literary and cultural studies;
- Identify some important writers, and film directors, and their works that explore environmental issues and raise public awareness about eco problems in China;
- Understand social, political, and economic factors that influence the environment through the lens of literary and visual representation;
