Chinese science fiction is now attracting the attention of the world. It has become a great source of literary imagination about China in Western scholarship. This course interrogates the genre of Chinese science fiction associated with other themes in humanities, including modernity, nation-building, gender, technology, and other issues. It further investigates how science fiction provides a lens through which modernity is negotiated between China and the world. The course is taught in Chinese.

- 1. Identify science fiction as a literary genre and the unique features of Chinese science fiction;
- 2. Understand the evolution of Chinese science fiction;
- 3. Appraise the specific ways in which Chinese science fiction criticizes the reality of modern China;
