

## ADMISSION AND RESIDENCE DEPOSIT POLICY

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January 2026

Deposits are required to apply to residence and for international students to secure admission and obtain a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) which is required for the study permit application.

**Residence Deposit:** All incoming students applying to residence must pay a non-refundable residence deposit of \$1,000. The deposit will be returned to the student at the end of the academic year. If room damage or lost keys are identified during the move-out inspection, the cost will be deducted from the deposit.

The residence deposit will only be refunded to students if Huron is not able to provide a space on campus.

**Admission Deposit/Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL):** All incoming international students must pay a non-refundable admission deposit of \$2,000 to secure their admission and obtain a PAL, required for their study permit.

The admission deposit will only be refunded in the event of a study permit rejection from the Government of Canada. Applicants must also provide evidence that their application was submitted to the IRCC prior to August 1<sup>st</sup>, using the support of Huron's Immigration Consultant. Please note, a \$200.00 processing fee will be deducted from the refund.

- *If a student is placed on a waitlist and the student provides a written request (from UWO email) to be removed from the queue before a room has been offered to them, a refund will be issued.*
- *If a student defers enrollment, the deposit will be held and applied to a future term. Cancellations are not eligible for a refund.*
