

ADMISSION AND RESIDENCE DEPOSIT POLICY

January 2026

Deposits are required to apply to residence and for international students to secure admission and obtain a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) which is required for the study permit application.

Residence Deposit: All incoming students applying to residence must pay a non-refundable residence deposit of \$1,000. The deposit will be returned to the student at the end of the academic year. If room damage or lost keys are identified during the move-out inspection, the cost will be deducted from the deposit.

The residence deposit will only be refunded to students if Huron is not able to provide a space on campus.

Admission Deposit/Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL): All incoming international students must pay a non-refundable admission deposit of \$2,000 to secure their admission and obtain a PAL, required for their study permit.

The admission deposit will only be refunded in the event of a study permit rejection from the Government of Canada. Applicants must also provide evidence that their application was submitted to the IRCC prior to August 1st, using the support of Huron's Immigration Consultant. Please note, a \$200.00 processing fee will be deducted from the refund.

- *If a student is placed on a waitlist and the student provides a written request (from UWO email) to be removed from the queue before a room has been offered to them, a refund will be issued.*
- *If a student defers enrollment, the deposit will be held and applied to a future term. Cancellations are not eligible for a refund.*
