Beyond the Classroom

Huron's GLE major combines teaching, research, and experiential learning to explore public policy, civic engagement, social responsibility, and environmental stewardship in decision-making. Examples include:

- Through public policy courses, GLE students conduct primary research with community partners and complete internships in government, business, and non-profit sectors. Student-driven research projects have recently explored solutions to Canada's housing crisis, local implementation of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, and the City of London's response to health and homelessness.
- With guidance from faculty mentors, students design their own learning pathways and gain hands-on experience through partnerships with professional organizations. GLE public policy courses connect students to government decision-makers and policy stakeholders for field studies and experiential learning.



CAREER INTERNSHIPS

Get paid part-time experience during the school year or full-time in summer. These roles align with your interests and help build your resume with real-world value.

ACADEMIC INTERNSHIPS

Earn while you learn. Take 4-16 months off between Year 3 and Year 4 for a full-time, for-credit, paid internship. Many students receive job offers after completion.



RESEARCH INTERNSHIPS

Work with a Huron faculty member for support on a student research fellowship with funding up to \$1,500 or a paid research assistant opportunity.



Get support to ideate, plan, and launch a new business. You'll get 1:1 coaching, access to funding, and other resources to set you up for success.



Travel Study

Embark on an international adventure and gain hands-on experience, build community, and explore different cultures. Huron University provides experiential learning opportunities abroad, as well as support to students for international exchanges. Partnering with a European policy laboratory, GLE students and faculty travel to the Basque Country, Spain, to explore collaborative governance innovations.
