Beyond the Classroom

Learning at Huron doesn't stop at the classroom door. Our students expand their knowledge through real-world experiences that connect theory to practice, deepen cultural understanding, and build the skills needed to thrive in any career path. Research and Community-based projects that the Centre for Global Studies has explored include:

- Supporting community through newcomers & higher education: In partnership with London's Cross-Cultural Learning Centre, students develop tools and workshops that help newcomer youth access postsecondary education, campus life, and community involvement in Canada. The program fosters academic success, leadership, and wellbeing through meaningful collaboration and engagement.
- Practical rights actions through bicycling: Students examine how human movement shapes the world, exploring how car-centered cities have restricted social connection and creativity. Focusing on bicycling and other diverse forms of mobility, they consider how reimagining movement can inspire social innovation and strengthen community development.
- Thinking in (the) public (interest): Students explore forms of action that drive positive social change beyond traditional institutions and measures of leadership. Through community-engaged learning, the seminar challenges participants to think and act outside conventional frameworks to imagine new possibilities for transformative praxis.



CAREER INTERNSHIPS

Get paid part-time experience during the school year or full-time in summer. These roles align with your interests and help build your resume with real-world value.

ACADEMIC INTERNSHIPS

Earn while you learn. Take 4-16 months off between Year 3 and Year 4 for a full-time, for-credit, paid internship. Many students receive job offers after completion.



RESEARCH INTERNSHIPS

Work with a Huron faculty member for support on a student research fellowship with funding up to \$1,500 or a paid research assistant opportunity.



Get support to ideate, plan, and launch a new business. You'll get 1:1 coaching, access to funding, and other resources to set you up for success.



Through a special partnership with World University Services of Canada (WUSC), students can complete international community development placements with partners across Asia, Africa, the Caribbean, and the Middle East. As WUSC volunteers, they collaborate with local organizations to co-create youth-inclusive, gender-responsive, and market-relevant programs and services.
