### Course Description:

Using an application/interview process, students are selected for an 8-16-month work term in a sponsoring community partner organization approved by the Management and Organizational Studies department at Huron. During the work term, students will meet weekly with their instructor and fellow students for a status check-in, mentoring, sharing, and peer feedback. Following the work term, interns must complete an oral presentation to the professor on work undertaken during the internship. Students will also develop a poster to summarize their presentation and deliver its contents at attendance at the follow-year's internship open house.

### Learning Outcomes:

1) Learn about how to apply theories to practice
2) Comprehend how organizational decisions are made in context
3) Develop people-related skills and understand how to accomplish personal and professional objectives
