# ÖREBRO UNIVERSITY

Örebro University was granted full university status in 1999 and is now one of Sweden's most expansive universities, with 17,000 students and 1,600 staff. Exchange students can choose from a wide range of courses in various subjects, all taught in English.

## ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

At the start of the semester, an orientation programme is organised for all exchange students by the International Office, in cooperation with the international student section Nexus. During the orientation programme a number of social events will be arranged together with Swedish students. There will also be practical and academic information about studies and life in Sweden. Students will also learn how to find their way around campus. There is a fee for participating in some of the social events of the orientation programme. ## HOUSING

All exchange students are guaranteed student accommodation provided that we have received the application on time. All student accommodation has shops, health-care centres and other services within easy reach. The cost for housing is 25 000 - 30 000 SEK (approx. 2200-2700 EUR/2500-3000 USD)\* on semester basis.

## COST OF LIVING

The average cost of living per month is around 11 000 SEK (approx. 1000 EUR / 1100 USD)\* including rent.

## STUDY SYSTEM

At Swedish universities, courses and modules are mainly studied one at a time. For example, a student takes a full-time course of 7.5 ECTS credits for five weeks, which also includes examination. When the course is completed, the student takes up the next course. Studies are measured in ECTS credits and 1.5 ECTS credits are equivalent to one week of full-time study.

## COURSES AND COURSE LOAD

Exchange students must be full-time students and take 30 ECTS credits per semester. Exchange students can choose from across the range of courses offered in English at Örebro University, as long as they meet the prerequisites and as long as the courses are not full. ## NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Please note that exchange students need to be officially nominated by their home university. All partner universities are notified when the online nomination form opens. The application for admission and housing is online. The only supporting document needed is a transcript in English stating all courses, grades and credits at university level. However, for students applying for music courses, recordings are also required. ## INSURANCE

All incoming exchange students are covered by the insurance Student IN, supplied by Kammarkollegiet (The Legal, Financial and Administrative Services Agency). The insurance is limited and covers for example necessary and reasonable costs for emergency medical or dental care if the insured suffers illness or has an accident during the policy term. EU/EEA students should primarily use the European Health Insurance Card issued in their home countries. Please read the terms and conditions carefully. An additional insurance might be necessary. - One health: Challenges and solutions at a regional scale.

**Nomination period:** 1 – 30 September 2026  
**Application deadline:** 15 October 2026  
**Orientation:** 18 January – 7 February 2027  
**Semester begins:** 18 January 2027  
**Semester ends:** 6 June 2027  
**Rental period for housing:** 17 January – 7 June 2027
