#### **Course Description:**

This course will examine the nature and enabling conditions of Indigenous-Settler reconciliation in Canadian colonial contexts. Relationality, a lived principle recognizing kinship and interdependence between all beings, will be considered as a potential method for reconciling nation-to-nation relationships. The course focuses on texts and videos from Indigenous authors, knowledge-carriers, and elders.

#### Learning Outcomes:

Theoretical and applied understanding of the concepts of reconciliation and relationality.

Introductory familiarity with some Indigenous philosophical thought, methodology, and pedagogy on Turtle Island.

Better understanding of and critical, reasoned, felt engagement with an important moral and political challenge.

Improved listening, oral, written, and intercultural communication skills.

Improved reasoning and critical thinking skills.

Increased motivation and competence with self-directed learning, expressed as increased ability to independently find and engage with Indigenous knowledges and presences when appropriate.
