Course Description:

This course is an introduction to the philosophy of law. We will attempt to understand law and legal practice by exploring the relationship between law and morality and the relationship between adjudication and reasoning. We will also consider criticisms of this approach by feminist jurisprudence, critical race theory and legal pluralism.
