Course Description:

Both religion and culture create meaning through the art of the "remix," from hip-hop sampling to sacred texts and artworks that creatively (mis)quote and re-interpret pre-existing traditions. This course explores intertextuality and creativity in religion alongside theory-driven investigation of global cultural expressions including DJ culture, comic books, and social media.

Learning Outcomes: one outcome per entry

- 1. Students will develop familiarity with the creative and theoretical frameworks around remixing, sampling, and intertextuality and how these relate to the creation and reception of religious texts and traditions;
- 2. Students will develop and articulate an understanding of the relationship between religious thought and imagination;
- 3. Students will analyze ancient and contemporary cultural products through the lens of transmission, re-interpretation, and appropriation;
- 4. Students will demonstrate creativity and depth in exploring the intersection of religion and culture through developing and presenting their research.
