Course Description:

How do we measure it? Every organization grapples with this question. Management accounting offers the tools to understand cost behaviour, allocate resources, capture financial and non-financial data, and evaluate performance. This course explores how these measurement techniques support planning, control, and strategic decision making.

Learning Outcomes: one outcome per entry

- Use Excel to organize and analyze data, prepare budgets, and create clear, well-structured reports that support management decision making.
- Understand new and emerging non-financial reporting standards, including sustainability standards.
- Analyze manufacturing (cost) variances and marketing variances to explain differences between Budget and Actual results.
- Distinguish between various Costing Systems – Job Order Costing, Process Costing, Activity Based Costing and Absorption/Variable Costing. Determine cost of goods sold, ending inventory under each method. Prepare, compare and reconcile financial statements prepared under Absorption versus Variable Costing.
- Classify costs as fixed, variable or mixed, and prepare a Statement of Cost of Goods Manufactured.
